

# FIPSG AUCTION No. 88 - 3 APRIL 2021

Auction 88 will be a postal auction. It is a private auction, all vendors are paid up members of the Study Group and bids will only be accepted from similar bona fide members. The last date for receipt of postal bids will be Sunday, **3rd April 2021**.

## CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. Each lot is sold subject to any reserve price, disclosed or not.
2. Subject to the above, the highest bid shall secure the purchase. Title shall pass at the fall of the hammer but ownership will transfer when payment is complete.
3. The conduct of the auction and the bidding shall be regulated by and be at the discretion of the Auction Manager, who has the right to refuse any bids and to terminate any dispute.
4. Bidding shall proceed by:- £1 steps to £20, £2 steps to £50, £5 steps to £100, £10 steps to £200 and £20 thereafter. A non conforming bid will be reduced to the next LOWER step and WILL NOT overbid a previous bid at this step. No conditional bid will be accepted.
5. Vendors have described their own lots and stated their estimates and reserves. The Study Group, its officers and Auction Manager accept no responsibility for any statements in the catalogue or elsewhere. Any dispute which arises under this auction subsequent to the sale shall be between vendor and buyer, although the Auction manager may act as arbitrator and determine the dispute.
6. The Study Group hold insurance (arranged by Wardrop & Co Ltd) for the benefit of members, covering the auction material from the time of delivery to the Auction Manager until safe return to the vendor or delivery to the purchaser. This may be extended to include the delivery transit but only at the discretion of the Auction Manager and his written confirmation of his acceptance of the description of the material and method of transit.

8. In the case of tied bids, the first bid received will be taken as the winner. The successful bid shall be one step above the next highest bid.
